BIBLE STUDY OF REVELATION

Often people look at the last book of the Bible and only think of calculating the end of time. It functioned in a more comprehensive way than that in the first Christian century. It exhorted Christians to keep the faith in the face of mounting regional repression “even unto death” (Rev. 12:11). Our study will look at the many ways this message can be found in John’s Apocalypse.

At work in the world . . .

As followers of Jesus, we believe that God is at work in the world and that we are called to join in that work. But how do we do this? How do we become a part of what God is doing?

First, we pray. We pray without ceasing. We pray at the beginning, we pray at the end, and we pray the whole way through. We pray because it is like breath to us. It is the way God gives us life. It is the way the Spirit works within us and forms us; it is just like in the beginning, when God formed Adam out of dirt, and breathed that first breath into his lungs.

Second, we pay attention. We look for places of need. We listen for the stories of people longing for something that seems unnamable, and we go. We encounter the world just as it is. When we do this, we find that we are encountering God, too.

As we pray, as we pay attention, and as we go, we become the body of Christ in the world around us. I don’t think this means we look for what we can do to help and leave it at that. It is

much more than that, much bigger, deeper, wider, and fuller. When we join God in what God is doing in the world, when we are the body, we are the very presence of Christ to those we encounter. Everything we do is filled with God’s grace. Everything we do is filled with a joy that can only come from Christ. Our good works are not our own but rather the works of Jesus done in us and through us. All of this is done to bring about redemption in this world that God created and loves. As a part of the body, we get to be part of that.

Coming up this month at Heritage, we will have *Operation Inasmuch*. We’ll gather at the church at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, September 11, and go out into our community to be the hands and feet of Jesus. Also, Richard and Jeanne Young, Ted Boone and Jayson Fields will be leaving that day for Mexico through Medical Missions Unlimited. Let’s keep them in our prayers as they join in what God is doing there.
