

Let those with eyes to see...

John's Gospel tells us a story about Jesus giving sight to a man born blind. The irony is that it is a blind man who helps us see Jesus in a whole new light..

It's easy to be blind to others, isn't it? We don't recognize a skill or talent. We miss some detail about a new hairstyle or item of clothing.

We miss other things, too. We get in a rush and miss the beauty of a sunset. Preoccupied, we miss the friend who was waving at us when we drove by. It's hard to see everything if you don't know where to look.

There are also things we don't want to see. People we can see but don't want to see right now. Things that make us uncomfortable, like suffering or injustice. Even things about ourselves that would just as soon ignore. So we turn a blind eye.

Sometimes I find that I need to have my eyes opened so that even the things I'm most familiar with I see anew.

A couple years ago, I was sitting with my friend Randy before surgery. Nurses came in

and out performing various "nursing" tasks. A nurse anesthetist came in and began some preparations and offered some assuring words about what she would be doing during the surgery.

Then, before she stepped out of the room, she added, "My name is Hope, and I'll be back in a few minutes."

Randy and I looked at each other in amazement. Now that's who I want with me me when I'm going into surgery: Hope!!

When she told us her name, we saw something new about her. She became so much more than a nurse. We thought we "knew" but then our eyes were opened. Who doesn't want to see "hope" when going into surgery?

Jesus invites us, His followers, to look at those around us, to look at ourselves no less, and see more than what we "know" about them. Imagine being able to see them and believe that the God of love and grace is at work in and through them too.

Coming up this month, we have an opportunity to see Jesus in a new light. *Cotton Patch Gospel* places the story of Jesus in a modern-day rural south setting. It's an eye-opening take on an ancient story that will get your toes tapping -- and stir your conscience, too.

Perhaps it's the fresh take we all need to open our eyes to the true wonder of the Gospel. And to its hope.

So whatever you do, don't blink, or you might miss it. See you Sunday.
