December 4 Second Sunday of Advent: Peace A Service of Lessons and Carols

The HBC Music Ministry tells the story of Christ's coming in this program of

scripture readings, carols and hymns of the season. Following worship, we share a meal together in Fellowship Hall. Please bring some homemade food to share or purchase a treat at the **Youth Bake Sale** that morning!

Wednesday, December 7 Church Supper and Community Christmas Caroling (Time change – 5:15 p.m.)

Following supper, join one of the caroling teams and spread some Christmas cheer!

December 11 Third Sunday of Advent: Joy "Asking Directions" (Isaiah 35:1-10; Matthew 11:2-9)

Even with GPS on our phones we sometimes get lost. So it's a wise move to pull over and ask directions. It helps to know where you're going by first understanding where you are.

December 18

Fourth Sunday of Advent: Love "Change Lanes — Baby on Board" (Isaiah 7:10-16; Matthew 1:18-25)

With his engagement to Mary, Joseph had his life all mapped out. And then he learned she was already pregnant and everything was now about to change.

"Holding Hope in Our Hands" (Isaiah 9:2-7; Luke 2:1-20)

Angels break open the heavens with songs of joy to announce the Good News for all people: the birth of "A Savior, who is Christ the Lord." A ragtag band of shepherds scamper into Bethlehem and find a newborn. They become the first to understand what it is like to hold hope in your hands.
