I started driving when I was about 6 or 7 years old. My dad would let me sit on his lap and hold the steering wheel on our little street. Sometimes he even let me steer the car into the garage.

When I got a little older, he sometimes let me drive on our street while he sat beside me. That was when I delivered the Sunday morning paper and no one else was on the road.

After I got my learner's permit, I took a driver's ed class. I started reading books about driving and heard lectures about driver safety. But it was no substitute for driving. With mom or dad beside me in the front seat, I ventured out on roads far beyond our neighborhood. I learned best how to drive by driving.

As a teacher, Jesus understood that the best way to learn something was by doing. His disciples watched Him pray; then they used His example to pray. His disciples listened to Him preach and saw Him heal; then Jesus sent them

It's still true today. If you want to know about prayer, the best way is to start praying. Want to learn a subject well? Start teaching that subject to others and you'll learn more than you'll ever be able to share. If you want to know God's will, start doing the things that Jesus did. For it is in the doing that our faith grows richer and our experience of God deepens.

At the conclusion of last Sunday's worship, I offered a challenge to engage in some "doing" in the name of Jesus. Simple things. Practical things. For those who might have missed it, I've added it below. Take a task and become a "doer of the Word." Then reflect on the experience. Come to worship and share some of your stories. Perhaps in the doing, we'll hear Jesus in fresh ways speaking to each and all of us through our hearts and heads and hands.

Hearing and Doing

Want to practice hearing and doing? Take this short list, read the items out loud, and do them. And add to them!

- 1. Take your bulletin home after worship and throughout the week, pray for someone on the prayer list.
- 2. No matter where you are, join with the women's prayer group this summer by taking time at some point each Wednesday to pray for someone on our weekly prayer list.
- 3. Send a card to someone on the prayer list or another person on your mind a card of thanks, or encouragement, or simply a note to brighten someone's day.
- 4. Make a meal for guests at the Good Neighbor homeless shelter or the Advocates Flowery Branch children's shelter here in town, or the Tranquility Women's shelter.
- 5. Bake cookies or some other special dessert for one of the shelters.
- 6. Make a meal for a single parent and her/his children.
- 7. Attend Bible study and worship. Come prepared to offer your own insights in the discussion. Volunteer to read scripture or serve as a greeter to welcome others.
- 8. Help plan an informal gathering of your Bible study group at someone's home. Invite a friend or neighbor.
- 9. Volunteer to help with the unique VBS event Robyn has planned in June.
- 10. Carry a small cooler of bottled waters; hand them to the homeless, or people who are working outside in the heat.
- 11. Bake cookies and offer cold water/lemonade to the folks who pick up the trash/recycling in your neighborhood.
- 12. Visit a senior adult who no longer gets out much. Go to their home and spend time listening to them.
- 13. Go visit residents in a care facility near you.
- 14. Sign up to deliver summer lunches in the Emerson community one weekday this summer.
- 15. Invite someone to come to church with you.
- 16. Add your own ideas to this list!

What else could you do? Listen to God's Spirit nudging you to respond to needs around you. Let these ideas and your own help you to hear Jesus' voice, and lead you toward life in all its fullness.
